

I was going on my 9th year of working as a summer camp counselor near my home in Illinois, and I had lost the magic that made the work of connecting with kids in nature so important. A friend of mine visited Wilderness Awareness School and came home with stories of adults finding their magic again. I immediately decided to sign up.

I had no idea how much I was going to receive from the community at Wilderness Awareness
